The BC Vaccine Card has launched and is now required to access certain higher risk social and recreational events and businesses. Requiring proof of vaccination will go a long way in making sure nonessential businesses can stay open with a much lower risk of potential transmission of COVID-19.

The BC Vaccine Card is simple and secure. People receive a unique QR code that provides proof of vaccination, which can be displayed either on a smartphone or on a printed copy.
